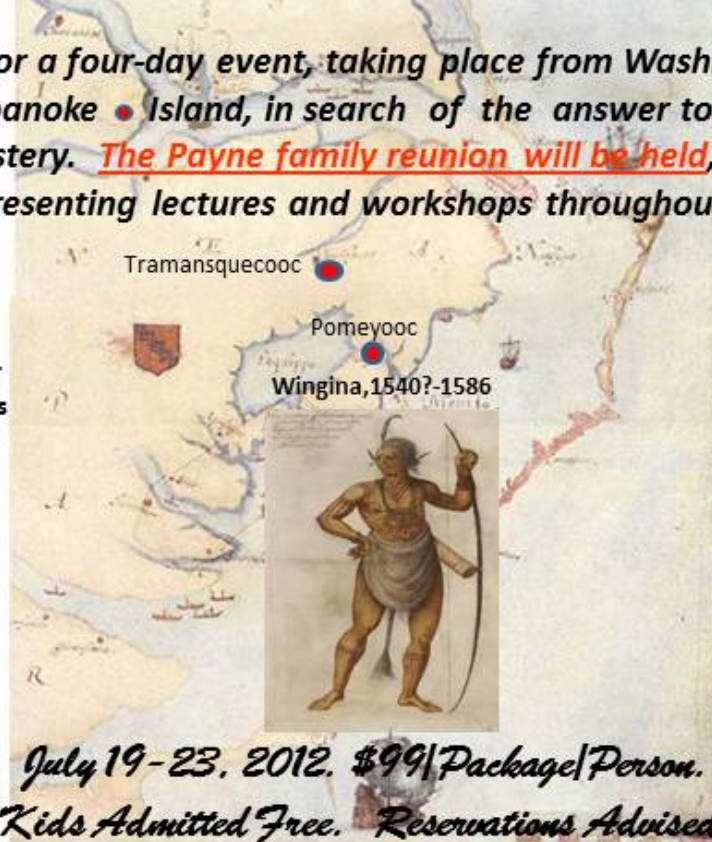

- Friday, July 20: **8 AM**-Opening Introduction and discussions of research parameters, and planning for the first day's field experiences, Washington NC waterfront (no charge). **8:30 AM sharp**-Leave for trip to the presumed location of Eleanor Dare Stone (\$50, dress for digging & hiking, bring bug spray, snacks & drinks available if pre-ordered). **2 PM to 5:30 PM**-Afternoon brunch/lunch and main lectures at Down On Main Street Restaurant (order by menu, light hor'durves or full dinners, & pay cash). **5:30 PM to 9:30 PM**-"Browse, carouse, wine & dine" downtown Washington, and wine & cheese social at Artisans' Center, Main St., with multiple interesting workshops in the back (no charge).

The ghost image is of the Indian King Wingina, who first befriended then later turned against the 1585 colony. Possibly born 1540 (circa) & was assassinated by Ralph Lane at Dasman's-quepace on June 1, 1586, striking fear and hatred amongst the coastal Carolina Indians.
